

Feedback SDP – School Council Meeting – Feb 10, 2026

<p>In what ways have you learned about our SDP?</p>	<p>Most parents indicated that they have attended an in-person presentation explaining the School Development Plan and how the school is supporting student learning. A very small percentage of parents reported viewing the SDP document on the school website.</p>
<p>My child’s learning can benefit from the goals, outcomes, actions and resources in the SDP.</p> <p>The learning of all students is reflected and prioritized in the goals, outcomes, actions and resources in SDP.</p>	<p>All parents commented that they can see a clear connection between their child’s learning and the SDP. They also shared excitement about learning more about mentors and anchor texts and how these approaches will help re-engage their children in reading aloud. A small percentage of parents expressed concerns about reduced EA support for students with special needs due to funding constraints.</p>
<p>What activities and services are most important to you?</p>	<p>Parents expressed a strong preference for field trips, noting that they encourage parent volunteering and increase engagement in their child’s learning. Many parents also raised concerns about the rising cost of living and the possibility that some families may not be able to afford trips to Calgary landmarks if these opportunities are not provided through the school.</p>
<p>The activities our school provides are important for my child’s learning.</p> <p>The school fees I pay are reasonable considering the benefit they provide for my child.</p>	<p>Parents expressed appreciation for the learning opportunities provided by the school and noted that the fees are very reasonable. Many parents also shared a willingness to contribute additional funds if their child’s teacher requests supplies for extra art projects or special learning initiatives.</p>
